Description:	This program provides a required component to become an AT assessor. Aseptic Technique (AT) protects patients during invasive clinical procedures by implementing infection control measures that minimise the presence of pathogenic organisms. Therefore it is essential that all healthcare workers understand the principles and practices of AT.
