Program Description

The interprofessional learning environment allows participants to develop analytical and critical thinking skills that have direct relevance to clinical practice in health care settings. Participants will lead their own project during this program, displaying an ability to critically evaluate health care.

Applications

Applicants are required to:

1. Submit a covering letter including:
 - Applicant introduction: Name, work area, clinical role
 - Reasons for applying
 - Outline of a quality improvement project idea (1 paragraph) suitable to be conducted in the applicant's workplace
 - Details of any previous experience in quality improvement or research
2. Provide confirmation of support from clinical lead (CNS, NM, HOD) for program enrolment and tentative project idea.
3. Meet with a researcher prior to confirmation of registration.
