It is designed to provide staff with knowledge and skills to assess patients with Falls risk, minimise the risk of falls injury and manage actual fall events. Sessions are fun and interactive; actual falls events are discussed and investigated. Sessions are delivered by multidisciplinary Falls subject matter experts and are based on the Australian and Safety and Quality Council Best Practice Guidelines for Preventing Falls and Harm from Falls.
