



Falls Management: Exploring the (un)conventional risks Clinical Program

<p>Description:</p>	<p>This advanced study day is designed to add value to consumer care in falls management. It will provide all disciplines of healthcare professionals with knowledge and skills to assess patients for a variety of unconventional / uncommon falls risk factors. Factors discussed in this study day are those that require consideration when holistically assessing the patient's risk and identifying interventions.</p> <p>Learners bring their own interpretation, experiences and cultural factors to a learning experience. Because of this the study day follows various learning styles and information delivery.</p> <p>The sessions are fun and interactive and actual falls events are discussed. Sessions are delivered by multidisciplinary falls subject matter experts and are based on the Australian Safety and Quality Council Best Practice Guidelines for Preventing Falls and Harm from Falls along with recent published evidence.</p>
<p>Learning objectives:</p>	<p>At the conclusion of this study day, the learner will have:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An increased knowledge of the financial impact of falls, both at state and national levels. • The knowledge and skill to recognise the less common risk factors for falls and consequential harm from falls. • The ability to incorporate into practice their newly gained knowledge and skills. • The opportunity to optimise delivery of care to consumers in reducing falls and harm from falls. • Information about falls risk factors that will ultimately enable the learner to self-direct their own further study, broadening their knowledge and skills. • Been able to network with health professionals from across WA.
